WOLVES

Find out about the way wolves live in the wild. How does the pack support the wolf? What do they eat? How is the pack structured?

You can choose how to present your findings, you could make a poster or make a PowerPoint.



GEOGRAPHY

Research where in the world wolves live in the wild. Are there any countries where they no longer live free? Why is this?

Can you create a world map showing their location?



NATURE

What different species of wolves are there in the world? Are any of them endangered? What is being done to help? How are zoos involved? You could write a report or make a film to explain your findings.



ART

Which artists have included wolves in their pieces? Are they painted, collaged, sculpted? Can you recreate one you admire or make your own piece of wolf art work?



SCIENCE

What is the difference between a solid, liquid and gas? Can you try out an experiment at home, there are lots of experiments on the internet. Record your results to share with the class.



WRITING

Can you write a story about wolves? Which stories in popular culture feature wolves? Maybe you can write an updated version of Little Red Riding Hood? You could record yourself reading your story or act it out with friends.
