## Our Curriculum

#### Intent

#### **Learn Aspire Achieve**

These drivers reflect the needs of our children and the values of our school. They underpin our curriculum and sit at the heart of everything we do. Our curriculum is designed to be challenging and offer children opportunities to think deeply about complex ethical and moral issues. Each term's theme is built around a genuinely open key question - what then follows in terms of learning should help children to form their own conclusions and decide upon their own answer to the question. We want children to learn to research, reason, justify and evaluate.

#### **Implementation**

Our curriculum is delivered through termly 'Learning Journeys' developed by dividing up the statutory skills and areas of coverage in the National Curriculum. This creative, cross curricular approach gives a greater sense of purpose and context to learning, enabling the pupils to gain a deeper and broader understanding of specific subject areas.

#### **Key questions and concepts**

Each Learning Journey or theme is intended to introduce our children to 'big ideas', key questions and concepts. Higher level vocabulary is also explicitly taught so that children are able to communicate and articulate ideas in more precise, sophisticated and mature ways. Additionally, each theme or learning journey has a number of texts associated with it to ensure that children are encountering high quality literature.



## Working with parents

We attach great importance to early and positive communication between school and parents. We see an effective home school partnership as being essential to a successful education. It has a direct relationship to the amount of progress a child makes. We operate an 'open door' policy which enables communication between teacher and parents. We produce a newsletter which is available on the school website - along with our regular blog, Twitter and Facebook feeds. Parent consultation meetings take place twice a year and a written report is sent home at the end of the year. There are regular opportunities to come into school and celebrate your child's successes.



# Special Educational Needs

We are committed to early identification and intervention for children with any Special Educational Need. We liaise closely with our feeder nurseries and believe that effective provision is enhanced by the close co-operation between school and home. Children with Special Educational Needs are entitled - and supported where necessary - to access our full creative curriculum. We have staff with a range of specialisms including speech and language, dyslexia and nurture provision. We work closely with speech therapists, occupational therapists, physiotherapists and the Educational Psychology Service. Please see further information on our website.

## Our meals are provided by Chartwells

are entitled to a free lunch under
the UIFSM [Universal Infant Free
School Meals] programme
launched by the government.
Please note however that this
relates to a main meal and not a
packed lunch. Should your child
require a packed lunch, this will
need to be provided from home.

## **Behaviour Policy**

Our behaviour policy is based around a positive reward system of whole school rewards, class rewards and individual rewards. We use class reward incentives in classrooms and individual rewards such as merits, golden tickets and Oscars presented in our weekly Funky Friday Achievement Assembly - which parents are invited to attend.

Any incidents of unkind or inappropriate behaviour are dealt with promptly and may result in a child receiving a yellow slip or being placed in a lunchtime behaviour workshop. Parents are informed at all stages.

## The School Day

Early morning activities are available in every classroom, this helps to settle the children quickly and enable learning to begin promptly.

Jewellery may not be worn for any physical activity in accordance with safety advice laid down by the County. All earrings and watches must be removed. No other jewellery is permitted in school. Children with pierced ears may only wear studs in school and these must be removed for PE and swimming

## **Attendance**

Punctuality and full attendance is encouraged. Lateness can be extremely disruptive to the daily class routine and can make it difficult for the child to start the day positively. We do not authorise holidays in term time. We are always available to support parents who are struggling to get their child into school.





## **Religious Education**

Religious Education (RE) is promoted in our school through a multi-faith and philosophical approach. Through stories, art, drama and visits to places of worship, your child will learn about all aspects of Christianity and other major religions like Hinduism, Islam, Sihkism and Buddhism. We have daily whole school or Key Stage 'assemblies' which cover a range of themes. Parents are invited to attend to celebrate such festivals such as Harvest, Christmas and Easter. On Monday mornings there is an assembly for the whole school which focuses on British values. Parents, grandparents and carers are invited to join us in our weekly Funky Friday Assembly to celebrate our pupils' achievements. You have the right to withdraw your child from assemblies on application to the Headteacher

# Sex and Relationship Education

Sex and Relationship Education (SRE) is taught through planned programmes that follow the requirements laid down in the National Curriculum and our SRE Policy. Parents are invited to come in to view materials used to teach SRE by class teachers prior to it being taught - and have the right to withdraw their child from Sex Education if they wish to by putting their reasons for withdrawal in a letter to the Headteacher.

### Homework

The aim of homework is to support and enrich children's learning, to develop independence and self-study skills.

The purpose of homework is to allow practice and consolidation of skills and knowledge learned in the classroom. It helps children to develop research skills and provides opportunities for individual work and for parent co-operation and support. Homework will be set for all children every Friday - the class teacher will explain what is expected and it will come

home on a homework slip and be on the Virtual Learning
Platform on the school's website.

Your child will be encouraged to regularly take a reading book home and we ask that you spend time each night reading with your child.



## **Admissions**

For our new to reception children, we liaise with feeder playgroups and nurseries to get to know the new children in order to make their start at Shoreham Beach Primary School as easy as possible. We also make visits to the Nurseries and Playgroups to observe the children in familiar settings. There will be opportunities for new parents and children to visit our school to see their new classroom and to get to know their new teacher.

At the beginning of the term, the Reception teachers will make a home visit to meet you and have a chat about what we do and how you can help settle your child to make the best start.

Reception aged children can be admitted in September if their 5th birthday falls in that school year. In common with other local primary schools, all children may be admitted at the beginning of the School Year in which they will be five years of age. Children start on a full-time basis at the beginning of the Autumn term. However, younger children, whose birthdays fall between 1st January and 31st August, may attend mornings only for the first term and full time from the beginning of the Spring term in January if their parents prefer.
