SHOREHAM BEACH PRIMARY - COVID-19 RISK ASSESSMENT (Important points from Gov. Guidance)

There cannot be a 'one-size-fits-all' approach where the system of controls describes every scenario. School leaders will be best placed to understand the needs of their schools and communities, and to make informed judgments about how to balance delivering a broad and balanced curriculum with the measures needed to manage risk.
Any members of staff who have helped someone with symptoms and any pupils who have been in close contact with them do not need to go home to self-isolate unless they develop symptoms themselves.
We recognise that younger children will not be able to maintain social distancing, and it is acceptable for them not to distance within their group.
All teachers and other staff can operate across different classes and year groups in order to facilitate the delivery of the school timetable.
For individual and very frequently used equipment, such as pencils and pens, it is recommended that staff and pupils have their own items that are not shared. Classroom based resources, such as books and games, can be used and shared within the bubble.
Governing boards and school leaders should have regard to staff (including the headteacher) work-life balance and wellbeing.
Supply staff and other temporary workers can move between schools.
Substantial modification to the curriculum may be needed at the start of the year, so teaching time should be prioritised to address significant gaps in pupils' knowledge with the aim of returning to the school's normal curriculum content by no later than summer term 2021

For pupils in key stages 1 and 2, school leaders are expected to prioritise identifying gaps and re-establish good progress in the essentials (phonics and reading, increasing vocabulary, writing and mathematics).
Schools should note that there may be an additional risk of infection in environments where you or others are singing, chanting, playing wind or brass instruments or shouting. This applies even if individuals are at a distance.
Physical activity in schools: Pupils should be kept in consistent groups, sports equipment thoroughly cleaned between each use by different individual groups, and contact sports avoided.
Music, dance and drama should be a part of the curriculum as it builds pupils' confidence and supports their wellbeing. Staff need to follow Gov guidance on how to teach these safely.
Educational visits: these are not recommended.
