Also, if you've got any time to spare in the Easter holidays, I will be in on Wednesday, Thursday and Friday morning during the second week....



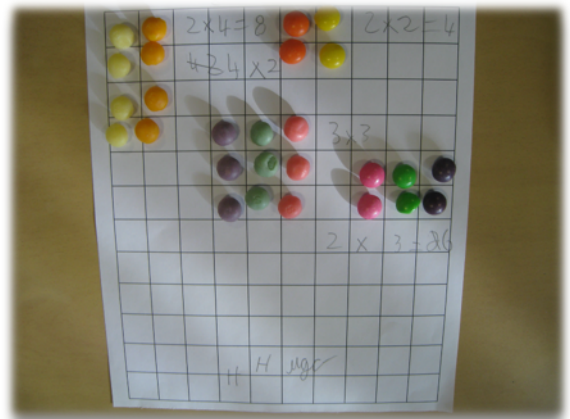
Number on Roll
