Gov. Guidance September 2021

> Gov no longer recommend that it is necessary to keep children in consistent groups ('bubbles'). This means that bubbles will not need to be used in schools from the autumn term.

> As well as enabling flexibility in curriculum delivery, this means that assemblies can resume, and you no longer need to make alternative arrangements to avoid mixing at lunch.

> Face coverings are no longer advised for pupils, staff and visitors either in classrooms or in communal areas.

Hygiene

> Hand hygiene

Frequent and thorough hand cleaning should now be regular practice. You should continue to ensure that pupils clean their hands regularly. This can be done with soap and water or hand sanitiser.

> Respiratory hygiene

The 'catch it, bin it, kill it' approach continues to be very important.

> Use of personal protective equipment (PPE)

Most staff in schools will not require PPE beyond what they would normally need for their work.

Keep occupied spaces well ventilated

> During the day it is important to ensure that the school (classrooms) are well ventilated and that a comfortable teaching environment is maintained.

> Further steps to improve fresh air flow when holding events where visitors such as parents are on site, for example, school plays.

> Mechanical ventilation is a system that uses a fan to draw fresh air or extract air from a room. These should be adjusted to increase the ventilation rate wherever possible and that only fresh outside air is circulated.

> Opening external windows can improve natural ventilation, and in addition, opening internal doors can also assist with creating a good flow of air.

You should balance the need for increased ventilation while maintaining a comfortable temperature.

Social distancing measures have now ended in the workplace and it is no longer necessary for the government to instruct people to work from home.

1) Individuals are not required to self-isolate if they live in the same household as someone with COVID-19, or are in close contact of someone with COVID-19.

2) All staff to continue to test twice a week (LFT).

3) Staff who do not need to isolate, and children and young people aged under 18 years 6 months who usually attend school, and have been identified as a close contact, should continue to attend school as normal. They do not need to wear a face covering within the

4) Settings will continue to have a role in working with health protection teams in the case of a local outbreak. If there is a substantial increase in the number of positive cases in a setting or if central government offers the area an enhanced response package, a director of public health might advise a setting to temporarily reintroduce some control measures.

5) When an individual develops COVID-19 symptoms or has a positive test

> Pupils, staff and other adults should follow public health advice on when to self-isolate and what to do. They should not come into school if they have symptoms, have had a positive test result due to the risk of them passing on COVID-19.

> If anyone in school develops COVID-19 symptoms, however mild, they will be sent them home and they should follow public health advice.

> If a pupil is awaiting collection, they should be left in a room on their own if possible and safe to do so. A window should be opened for

6) Staff with a positive LFD test result should self-isolate at home and arrange a PCR test as quickly as possible. Whilst awaiting the PCR result, the individual should continue to self-isolate.

If the PCR test is negative, it overrides the self-test LFD test and the staff member can return to school, as long as the individual doesn't have COVID-19 symptoms.

7) If a pupil or staff member is admitted to hospital with COVID-19 the school will seek advice. (DfE helpline 0800 046 8687 (option 1))

8) If the number of positive cases substantially increases extra action will need to be taken. This is because it could indicate transmission is happening in the school environment. The thresholds, detailed below, will be used as an indication for when to seek public health advice.

For most education and childcare settings, whichever of these thresholds is reached first:

• 5 children or staff, who are likely to have mixed closely, test positive for COVID-19 within a 10-day period; or

9) School will adentify groups that have been in close proximity to those testing positive for Covid-19.

10) Should thesholhds be reached school will review and reinforce the testing, hygiene and ventilation measures.

11) If a child or adult receives a posiive PCR test ten they must isolate for 10 days following Public Health guidance.
