Introduction for the Adur Family of Schools

The aim of this policy is to set out the requirements for school uniform. Shoreham Beach Primary School has a school uniform policy determined by the Governors and it is expected that all pupils will comply with it.

A school uniform looks smart, and clearly identifies the school, encourages a sense of belonging and helps good behaviour; pupils should wear the uniform with pride. This policy allows all pupils to feel included and reduces any inequalities or pressures of fashion.

We expect that, in choosing our school, you will give us your full support.

The above introduction has been formulated as a shared statement by all schools within the Adur Family of Schools.

Shoreham Beach Primary School is always willing to support families for whom the provision of uniform might cause financial difficulty. The criteria for this support are in line with that for free school meal assessment.

Uniform list

Grey trousers
Grey skirt (knee length)
White polo Shirt
Purple polo shirt
Purple sweatshirt/Cardigan
Purple fleece
Plain grey cardigan

Plain grey tights
Grey or white socks

Purple gingham dress for summer
Plain white or purple leggings can be worn under summer dresses.
Sensible black shoes or smart black trainers without logos.

Black shorts

'T' shirt in school colour (purple) with school logo.

No 'T' shirts with graphic logos.

Pupils must have a change of footwear for PE and games for hygiene reasons.

Swim hats and verruca socks (if needed) to be worn for swimming.

Tracksuits can be worn in winter.

Jewellery

In line with the West Sussex County Council policy, the school will only permit stud earrings. This is to conform with Health and Safety practice. During PE/Games lessons or activities, all earrings and watches will need to be removed, or earrings covered with tape if less than 6 weeks old.

Any exceptions, for medical or faith reasons, must be agreed between the Headteacher and parents or carers and recorded.

Hair

The school requires hair that is collar length, or longer, to be tied up for Health & Safety reasons, this is particularly important for Science, DT and PE/Games. We do not expect a child to have hair hanging in front of their face. Pupils are not allowed to have hair that is coloured or dyed nor to adopt an extreme hair style. Plain hair bands, scrunchies etc should be discrete and in school colours.

Make-up

The wearing of make-up is not permitted during school hours. Any exceptions, for medical or faith reasons, must be agreed between the Headteacher and parents or carers and recorded.
