

# Summer Term (B) Home Learning

Choose an animal that is endangered.

Find out lots of information about it.

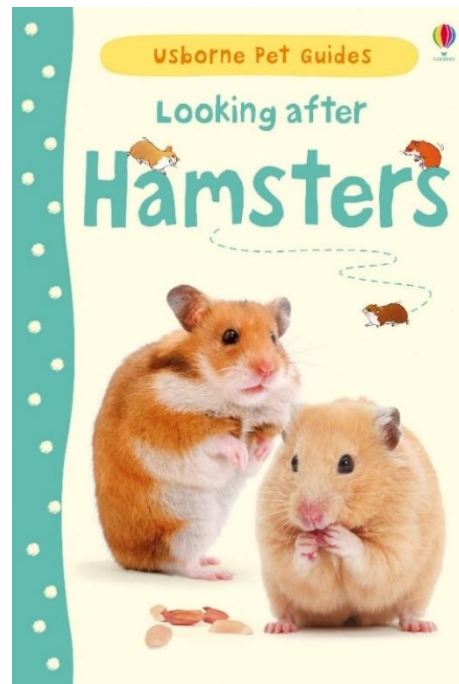
Draw a picture of it and write the information you have found out about the animal around the picture.



Many children have pets.

Do you have a pet?

You need to choose an animal that children have as pets and write a guide book about how to look after them.



Think about the people who work in the community whose job it is to look after us, to protect us – the police, the fire brigade, the ambulance service, the coast guard.

Often these people wear a uniform. For example:



Discuss with an adult how to call one of these people if you need help. Write and draw instructions how to call 999 and what you say.

**NEVER CALL 999 UNLESS IT IS AN EMERGENCY.**

Many animals in the wild have camouflage to help them blend into their environment. Their skin or fur are the same colours as where they live so that they cannot be seen easily. This may be to hide them from prey or from predators.



Choose an animal that has camouflage. Draw and colour it in and then cut it out. Then on a piece of paper, draw and colour its environment. Put your animal on top. Your animal should blend into its environment.

Protecting animals is not just important for animals in Africa and other parts of the world. Protecting animals is also important in England. There are a number of animals endangered in our own country: the red squirrel, the hedgehog, water vole, otters, beavers, the long-eared bat and many types of insects.



Try making a little bug 'hotel' – a place where insects can live and thrive. Don't make it too big. they could be pieces of wood tied together or wooden tubes like cane.

All story books (fictional stories) have exciting front covers that give a clue as to what the story is all about.



Choose a book that you have just read. Think about what the story is all about – the plot. You are going to create your own front cover for the book. It needs to be more exciting than the book's actual front cover. The picture needs to give the reader an idea of what the book is all about. Think about colour and where you are going to write the title and author of the book.
